Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) services, various speakers

- (DdF) (HRSA) has a robust <u>public health website</u>. HRSA focuses mainly on primary care and public health, and health equity (environmental justice)
- (CG) HRSA/Maternal and Child Health mentioned the Title V block grants to state which includes a focus on pre-pregnancy, pre-natal and peri-natal infants. Because of the <u>Life Course approach</u>, MCH is newly interested in epigenetic and environmental health issues.
- (DB) HRSA/BPHC funds community health centers with a public health perspective. He ensures that their staff include the affected community's point of view in its care model.
- (LS) <u>ACF</u> is a federal agency funding state, territory, local, and tribal organizations to provide family assistance (welfare), child support, child care, Head Start, child welfare, and other programs relating to children and families.
- (JA, JM) <u>CMS</u> provides health coverage for 100 million people through Medicare, Medicaid, and the Children's Health Insurance Program. And with health insurance reforms and health care exchanges, they are improving health care and ensuring coverage for all Americans. They work with states, who administer the Program.
 - Some specific services they provide: test kids for lead if needed, provide \$ for pre-natal pregnant women, serve disabled and low income from birth to 64, provide early periodic diagnostic screening for folks under 21 years old to guarantee they get their needs met. In Washington, kids who don't have medical/dental insurance may qualify for Apple Health for Kids.

Speaker:

Dr. Steven G. Gilbert, Director and Founder of the Institute of Neurotoxicology and Neurological Disorders (INND), has a Ph.D. in Toxicology from the University of Rochester, and is a Diplomat of American Board of Toxicology (D.A.B.T.). His book, *A Small Dose of Toxicology- The Health Effects of Common Chemicals* addressing everyday concerns about toxicology was published in 2004 (see www.asmalldoseof.org).

His talk focused on his recent trip to Gaza and the children's environmental health issues he observed, including: rampant lead exposure because of leaded gasoline used in personal generators, prevalence

and acceptance of smoking, kids not having safe public places to play and unregulated pesticides used on the food supply.
